2 Fat Quarters
1 spool of matching thread for construction
Scissors
Wonder Clips
Fabric Marker that is visible on your fabric

Interfacing Kit (pick up before class—needed for homework)

1/2 yard Pellon SF101

1/2 yard Pellon FlexFoam

Shoe Kit (included in class fee—will be given during class day)

HOMEWORK:

Come to class with your fabrics prequilted for more sneaker construction time in class.

The exterior fabric is fused to the woven interfacing. Layer that just like a quilt with foam and lining. The right sides of both fabrics should be facing out. Aim for a smooth fuse—feet are sensitive!

Any machine quilting is fine as long as the quilting lines are no more than an inch apart. I usually use a 3/4" grid or 1/2" channel quilting (parallel to the long edge of the fat quarter. Free-motion, longarm, machine serpentine or meander, random straight lines all look great.
